As a former elementary school teacher and in my current elected and appointed roles in San Mateo County, I am inspired by Diana's desire to participate in the State's goal to building a statewide data system to provide actionable insights to address our seemingly impenetrable educational equity gaps. I truly believe that we can make longstanding and sustainable systemic changes to improve educational and life outcomes for all kids, but state and local policymakers, education and community service providers, and families have long been attempting to do this work in silos, without sufficient and streamlined data to leverage essential collaboration and initiatives. I believe that Diana's experience, leadership, perspective, community connection, and commitment to closing equity and opportunity gaps for kids in San Mateo County through the use of data across multiple systems would be *invaluable* to this Advisory Board in its work to help ensure that the State can leverage the Cradle-to-Career Data System for maximum impact by linking early learning through postsecondary education, health and human services, and workforce data.

Oliver has an extensive repertoire of working with education data for policy and institutional decision-makers and shepherding data tools for consumers.

I have known Oliver since we both worked at the U.S. Department of Education (ED). During our tenure at ED, our work focused on postsecondary data. While I was in the business of collecting data for the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS), he was serving the public by working on releasing the online <u>College Scorecard</u> that allows consumers to compare various metrics on postsecondary institutions. Of note, what the College Scorecard did differently from other federal online tools was amalgamate national data collections (i.e., IPEDS, office of financial aid, and Treasury data) and display that data in five areas: college costs, graduation rates, employment rates, average borrowed amount, and an institution's loan default rate. Such an achievement is commendable, considering the challenges of linking and protecting data at the federal level. From this example, Oliver demonstrates a deep knowledge and expertise in data systems management analytical use cases at the national level.

Oliver also has extensive experience with California's data issues and needs. He has led the work on the State Equity Report Card at Ed Trust. This online tool assesses a state's opportunity and success outcomes for Black and Latino students, such as college degree attainment, enrollment, and completions. More recently, Oliver directed <u>College Insight</u>, a user-friendly college profile search tool developed by The Institute for College Access & Success (TICAS).

These highlighted efforts speak only a sliver of Oliver's commitment to making data useful, accessible, timely, and relevant to the needs of its users. I encourage the selection committee to speak to Oliver to understand his exceptional understanding of the U.S. educational pipeline, its leaks, and how data can help inform and shrink the inequities faced by students from various backgrounds. I hope that you will strongly consider allowing Oliver serve on C2C Data and Tools Advisory Board. He will undoubtedly contribute to helping in C2C's efforts.

ARI is a non-profit, community-based organization established in 1980 with offices in Sacramento and Los Angeles. We provide direct services, including outreach and education and navigation services for health programs, multiple social services and workforce development programs, as well as conduct advocacy on behalf of Asian American, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islanders (AANHPIs), immigrants, refugees and communities who are limited-English proficient across California. We have also promoted policies to improve the racial and health equity of the current health care system, including advocating for increased cultural and linguistic access to health care services and the expanded collection and reporting of disaggregated demographic data, such as race, ethnicity, language, gender, gender identity and sexual orientation, age, and other relevant categories.

For the last three years, ARI has worked and partnered with Gabriella and The Children's Partnership (TCP) on releasing <u>annual data snapshots</u> that center the resilience of California's approximately <u>1.5 million children and youth who identify as Asian American in California</u>, some of the challenges and inequities they face, and community-defined protective factors and programs that support their well-being. Through working with her on this project, we believe that Gabriella has the perspective, skills, and experiences that would benefit C2C's Data & Tools Advisory Board.

Part of ARI's work is dedicated to advocating for policies that support the health and well-being of Asian communities, including children and families. We have utilized the <u>fact sheet</u> to advocate for policies of state and local government agencies to disaggregate data among the diverse Asian subpopulations, who come from many different cultures, speak dozens of different languages, and have a range of different immigration, education and socio-economic experiences in the U.S. The disaggregated data in the Fact Sheets illuminate health disparities that may be masked when collapsing data only into general aggregated race categories. We also have shared it with community-based organizations who directly work with children and families from Asian communities to help support their work.

Gabriella has a strong familiarity with state data sets that can be used to paint a statewide picture of the state's Asian children and some of the challenges they may face. For these <u>fact</u> <u>sheets</u>, we collect and analyze data from multiple sources, including using data from the CA Department of Education to highlight assets like the number of Asian American children who are bilingual and the various languages they speak other than English. The snapshots also highlight where inequities exist impacting Asian American children in CA public schools,

including the number of Asian American children and youth who are experiencing homelessness and the high share of Asian American children who experience bullying and harassment. We release the data snapshots with updated data from these and other sources every year.

She also has an in-depth knowledge of data equity principles that acknowledge and seek to address the ways of collecting and disseminating data that have harmed historically marginalized communities and made them invisible, including Asian communities. She understood, for example, the importance of presenting data that are unique to children from AA subgroups and separated from NHPI communities, despite data sources often presenting data on people from AANHPI communities as an aggregated single group under the Asian category and aggregating AAs together with NHPI communities.

The data presented in the fact sheets acknowledge the unique assets, needs and challenges that children from historically marginalized and vulnerable communities face, ultimately helping inform collective advocacy to improve their well-being in California and center community solutions. We are confident Gabriella would continue to seek input from us and other organizations and data experts from AANHPI communities in the state through her role on this board.

For these reasons, we wholeheartedly support the application of Gabriella Barbosa of The Children's Partnership's to the Cradle-to-Career Data & Tools Advisory Board.
