Her dissertation on Competency-Based Education included how its departure from the traditional credit hour model of higher education complicates the delivery of financial aid.

Jessica started working as an analyst at the CSAC in January 2017 and was a founding member of the research team in September 2017 where she continued to advance until taking over as its Division Chief in January 2023.

#### **Changes to FAFSA Data**

 CA Dream Act Application (CADAA) is unaffected, but sharing of data risks student identification

- Demographic data not transferred starting in 2023-24
  - Gender and race/ethnicity

- Limited use of FTI data from the IRS
  - All contributors must consent to IRS transfer for FAFSA to be processed

#### What Does This Mean?

- For CSAC's data shared to Cradle-to-Career:
  - No gender
  - No income (but yes SAI)

- For CSAC's public reporting:
  - No income bands or average income, no household sizes
  - Yes award amounts, GPAs, asset information
  - Limited ability to report on partially completed FAFSAs (Race to Submit)
