- Fall 2025 admission at 10 universities: Channel Islands, Chico, East Bay, Humboldt, Maritime, Monterey Bay, San Bernardino, San Francisco, San Marcos and Sonoma

Riverside County Direct Admissions Early Outcomes

- 15% increase in students who applied as first-time freshman from Riverside County
- 36% increase in admitted students from Riverside County at CSU Monterey Bay
- 56% increase in new students from Riverside County that have committed to CSU San Bernardino (before May 1st!)
- Importance of complement admission with financial aid information
