At this meeting, the Community Engagement Advisory Board (CEAB) will review and give input on the California Cradle-to-Career Data System's (C2C) five-year anniversary as it relates to the Office of California Cradle-to-Career Data System's (Office) continuous improvement and celebration. This staff report is broken down into two main parts: section one, Data Academies, and section two, C2C's 5-year anniversary.

Requested Action:

The Office is requesting written feedback on this agenda item from Advisory Board members.

Background:

C2C will celebrate its fifth anniversary this summer, marking an important milestone. This moment offers a chance for reflection and celebration while looking ahead. Advisory Board members will learn about the Office's plans to expand data literacy through Data Academies, as outlined in [C2C's FY 25-26 workplan](#), and receive a preview of planned events for C2C's 5-Year Anniversary.

Section One: Data Academies

Section One, Part A: Understanding Data Academies

C2C is expanding Outreach and Training efforts in 2026 by conducting [Data Walks](#) throughout California to ensure equitable access to and use of C2C's available tools and resources. Data Walks will provide a roadmap for replicating

and scaling similar data engagement efforts, developing customized training, webinars, and on-demand resources that the Office is calling Data Academies. Data Academies will be a suite of data literacy resources for different stakeholders. During this Community Engagement Advisory Board (CEAB) meeting, members will receive an overview and provide feedback on draft resources that will serve as the foundation for a Train-a-Trainer program, which members have expressed interest in in the past and have seen most recently in a 2025 proposal from Community Engagement Advisory Board members, Gamboa and Takagi.

The Office is working to develop curriculum and corresponding materials for Advisory Board members to effectively describe the work of the Office and the data system to their audiences. C2C is contemplating the areas of focus to include in resources, which could include:

- ❖ C2C's Mission, Vision, and Values
- ❖ Linked and available data
- ❖ Data privacy
- ❖ Analytical data tools
- ❖ C2C's proposal process
- ❖ Partnerships and collaborations

C2C will celebrate its fifth anniversary this year and launch an anniversary campaign in July 2026. Beginning this summer, the Office will host events to

Planned activities include an interactive, data-focused hackathon, where data enthusiasts will come together to focus on an issue or challenge using available data in innovative ways, and a Community Data Day, which will connect the public, C2C's data providers, and partners to highlight the benefits of a statewide linked data system.
